At 13, Mattie Stepanek became a household name in the United States. Mattie was a best-selling author and a renowned conference speaker. He also appeared on several major national TV shows.

Mattie suffered from muscular dystrophy, a rare disease that had already claimed the lives of his three older siblings. Mattie's mother, Jeni, also suffered from the same disease. Mattie needed to take a portable oxygen tank on wheels with him wherever he went. Many times his illness would land him in bed in the intensive care unit of the children's hospital. Outside, Mattie was only able to move about in his motorized wheelchair. Even though Mattie battled a terminal illness for many years, Mattie never saw his condition as an obstacle between him and his goals.

He began writing when he was about 3 years old. Before he passed away in June, 2004, Mattie had written thousands of poems, dozens of essays and short stories, and presented the collection of his works to the Library of Congress. You might expect Mattie's poems to be full of gloom. But actually, his *Heartsongs* series of poetry books are known for their hope, humor and wisdom. He received many awards for his writing, including the Melinda A. Lawrence International Book Award in 1999 for "most inspirational work."

His love of reading and writing evolved into public speaking. During his short lifetime, he enthusiastically participated in fundraising events to help find a cure for neuromuscular diseases, and to encourage children and families suffering from these diseases to celebrate life until a cure is found. In Mattie's words, "People tell me I inspire them. And that inspires me. It's a beautiful circle, and we all go around together, with and for each other. What a gift."

Coral reefs are colorful underwater forests which teem with life and act as a natural protective barrier for coastal regions. The fishes and plants which call them home belong to some of the most diverse--and fragile--ecosystems on the planet.

In one year alone, 16 percent of the world's coral reefs were wiped out. A sea temperature change of a mere one degree Celsius would yield similar losses. Higher sea temperatures from global warming have already caused major coral bleaching events. Bleaching occurs when corals respond to the stress of warmer temperatures by expelling the colorful algae that live within them. Some coral reefs are able to recover, but too often the coral dies, and the entire ecosystem for which it forms the base, virtually disappears.

Warmer waters are also expected to increase the incidence of other coral diseases such as black band disease, white band disease, white plague, and white pox, all of which can lead to mass mortality of coral, and subsequently the entire ecosystem it supports.

Sea level rise caused by melting sea ice could also cause problems for some reefs by making them too deep to receive adequate sunlight, another factor important for survival.

To preserve these precious coral reefs, coral monitoring must be expanded to include water temperatures and coral bleaching rates if the managers expect to be able to effectively conserve these reefs as the climate warms. Research is needed to develop and implement new methods of restoring damaged or destroyed coral reefs.

Sometimes children are gone by force, which is like being stolen. It is important that the missing children are found and brought home as soon as possible. The sooner the public know about the incident, the sooner they might be able to help. Some people decided to start a program that would alert the public about the events of missing children right away. This program is called Care Alert.

The Care Alert program in California, USA is designed to spread the word to give television and radio stations important information about abducted children. These stations will then tell the public what happened in hopes that someone might come to help. The system promises to get the word out about

missing children faster than ever before. Anyone that may have seen something about the crime could then call the police. Only two people in any police agency will be able to declare a Care Alert. Both will be specially trained in child abduction. The new program is similar to the Emergency Broadcast System. When the Care Alert system is activated, television and radio stations will be alerted via fax or e-mail. They'll then break into programming to offer details on the abduction, apart from descriptions of the child, the abductor, and the suspect vehicle.

The new system is to be used only when an abduction fits a set of fairly narrow criteria. An abduction by a stranger must be *verified* by at least one witness. The more common sort of abduction, which involves a child taken by a non-custodial parent or another relative, will qualify for the Care Alert Program only if the child is felt to be in immediate danger of injury or if there is a strong suspicion that the child will be removed from the country.

Holidaymakers can insure their trips against the risk of cancellation caused by volcanic ash from the beginning of June following the launch of an optional add-on to standard travel insurance policies. From June 1, customers who are buying or renewing annual or single-trip policies from *Aviva* will be able to buy additional travel cover to protect against cancellation caused by airspace closure, or by an airport or port being closed for more than 24 hours from the date and time of scheduled departure.

The additional policy -- which costs £5 per insured person for a single trip or £10 per person for annual insurance --provides cover of up to £5,000 per insured person in the event of cancellation for travel and accommodation costs (including deposits) that policyholders cannot recover from their travel provider. If policyholders cannot return home to the UK because airspace is closed or because an airport or port they are scheduled or rescheduled to travel from or through is closed, the policy offers two options.

The first is to pay out £100 per insured person for every 24 hours that the policyholder is unable to return home. This is irrespective of any help given by the travel provider or airline, but is subject to a maximum of £1,500. The second is to pay out up to £1,000 per insured person if after 24 hours the tourist unavoidably has to make immediate alternative arrangements to get home, which your holiday provider cannot arrange. It will also pay for emergency medical supplies required to prevent a deterioration of an existing condition.
